DESCRIPTION:

The Caswell County Health Department has an opening for a Public Health Educator I. The employee in this position serves as the Minority Diabetes Prevention Program Coordinator. This position also works within the Healthy Communities program and focuses on health and racial equity work through community-based public programs and works to eliminate health disparities and racial inequity. Lastly, the Health Educator provides traditional health education to health department clinic patients.

Work is performed under the general supervision of the Health Services Coordinator, with leeway to exercise independent judgment within the framework of the applicable rules, regulations, program guidelines, policies, and procedures in the performance of duties, both in terms of planning and accomplishing work and in making decisions public health needs and requests.

Participation in a drug screen and background check are required.

Caswell County is an equal employment opportunity employer.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

The following are examples of typical work activities and responsibilities. The incumbent may be responsible for performing other related duties and responsibilities as required or assigned. A position may not include all the work examples given, nor does the list include all that may be assigned.

Coordinate the Minority Diabetes Prevention Program as part of a regional public health effort. This includes marketing of program, recruiting participants, and teaching classes. It also requires attendance at regional meetings.

Collaborate with local agencies and other community resources to implement initiatives promoting environmental and policy change in the areas outlined within in guidance from the state.

Plan, develop, coordinate, and evaluate population-based health initiatives.

Provide health education, as part of a multidisciplinary team, to clinic patients as identified by Providers.

Work with the local Government Alliance for Racial Equity Team to meet goals and objectives set forth in the Team's plan. Serve as part of local Health and Equity in All Policies implementation and evaluation team.

Serve as agency Public Information Officer

Other duties as assigned

TYPICAL QUALIFICATIONS:

Considerable knowledge of the principles and practices of public health and public health education activities

General knowledge of modern educational theory and techniques in the field of public health education

General knowledge of journalistic principles and methods of preparing subject matter in the promotion of public health activities

General knowledge of display techniques and skill in the arrangement of exhibits

Ability to work effectively with people on all educational levels and to maintain effective working relationships with local health departments, community agencies, and the public

Ability to write and speak effectively and to stimulate interest and cooperation among various groups in carrying out a program in public health education

MIMIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Graduation from a four-year college or university with a major in health education, **OR**

Graduation from a four-year college or university and completion of one year of on-the-job training as a public health educator, **OR**

A higher degree does not substitute for work experience.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

Possession of or ability to obtain a valid Drivers License for the type of vehicle or equipment operated.
